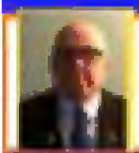

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR DISTRICT GOVERNOR – ART PECHT

Halfway?

It is hard to believe that my year is half over. We have made a lot of progress on many areas, but we still have many things left accomplished. Our membership as I am writing is still positive, we need to continue because we are going to lose a club after they celebrate 100 years of service, The West Chester club is closing after they celebrate 100 years of service on June 22. That will mean a loss of 23 members.

We need to decide what to do with our POD. The POD is owned by the district and has not been used very much. We are looking to find the appropriate home for it. If you have any thoughts or ideas, please reach out to any district officer and let us know what you think we should do.

I would like to encourage all lions from district 14 P to reach out to Mike Hepner our first vice district governor and lend him your support as he is looking to fill many cabinet positions.

We are also looking for someone to become our second vice district governor. I'm enclosing a piece that the qualifications have changed and many of you are eligible now.

A candidate for the office of second vice district governor shall:

1. Be an Active Member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
3. Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as second vice district governor:
 - a. As president of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the board of directors of a Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years; and
 - b. As zone chairperson, region chairperson, district global extension team coordinator, district global leader-
4. Has not completed a full term or major portion thereof as district governor.

As you can see, in addition to serving in the office of zone chairperson, region chairperson, cabinet secretary and/or cabinet treasurer, any Lion who has served as a district global extension team coordinator, district global leadership team coordinator, district global membership team coordinator, district global service team coordinator or district LCIF coordinator "for a full term or major portion thereof" will satisfy part of the criteria to qualify as a second vice district governor candidate.

It is important to note that a district LCIF coordinator's term is for three years. Therefore, any Lion utilizing service in this position to qualify for the office of second vice district governor must serve at least a majority of their three-year term before meeting these criteria.

Hello fellow Lions,

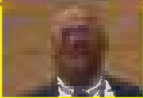

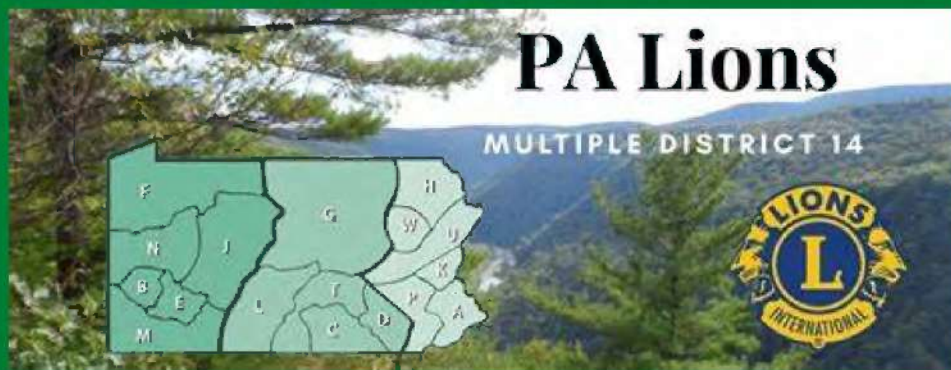

Lions under age 35, who previously opted out of the Leo-Lion program may rejoin the program, by contacting their club secretary. Those officers can update the member record in MyLCI by choosing the Leo-Lion member type on the club member page. Discount benefits are limited to the price of their active Leo-Lion membership for the dining period ending January 2025, and are not retroactive.

How the program works

A Cub club can be formed when five or more Cubs are working together with a Lions club. A Cub club may be held responsible for certain tasks at a Lions-planned event, or may even plan their own events and hold their own fundraisers. If a Cub club forms, a Lion member should be designated as the contact to the Cubs and reported in MyLCI.

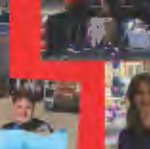
90 Acts of Kindness

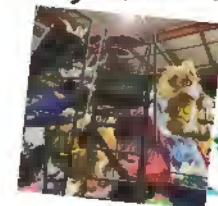

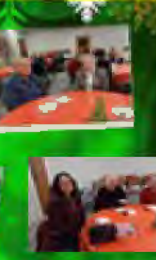

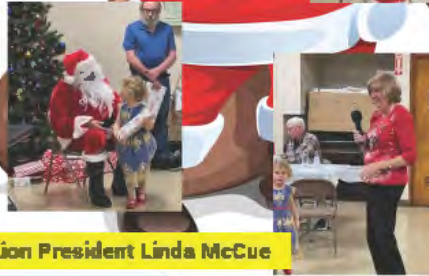
