14-P District Global Service Team Coordinator Report

Well Lions, we have completed two exciting District service projects so far this year!

Lions Pajama Drive

DG Art brought us the news last fall that a statewide Lions project to collect pajama sets to benefit foster care agencies and their families would be undertaken. DST Coordinator Doug Yingling assisted in collecting pajamas from Berks County clubs and FVDG Mike Hepner handled receiving those collected from Chester County. DG Art also obtained a grant of \$500 from LCIF toward the effort to add to what the clubs were doing individually.

District 14-P stepped up in a big way and collected approximately 500 pajamas. District Governor Art then took our pajama contributions to the state council meeting where they were added to all the pajamas collected statewide, sorted, packaged and re-boxed. Statewide, 3911 pairs of pajamas were collected! Returning our area's shares from the meeting, DG Art delivered the Chester County portion to the office of Chester County Children and Youth. In Berks County, Doug Yingling delivered them to benefit the foster care program conducted by Diakon Child, Family and Community Ministries in Topton.

District Lions Recognize American Legion Post 217 Honor Guard

On behalf of all the Lions club members of District 14-P of Berks and Chester Counties, the Ray A. Master American Legion Post 217 Funeral Honor Guard of Topton were honored for their ongoing service to our veterans and their families at their meeting on December 18 th and presented with a framed certificate of appreciation representing the Lions of District 14-P. Each of the members present also received the same certificate in a presentation folder individually. The recognition was planned by GST Coordinator Doug Yingling. District Governor Art Pecht and Doug presented the framed certificate to Charles Ackerman, Chaplain and coordinator of the Honor Guard.

April 27 we will be holding a Kauffman's chicken BBQ sale at the Helping Harvest.


Thanks to Lion William Jaeger of the Exeter Township Lions Club, we are having a successful gift card sale through Giant, Redner's and Weis grocery stores.

As per the Constitution, each chartered Lions club in good standing with the District shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) member or major fraction thereof (major fraction is 5 or more). Should your club have a PDG as a member, they will receive their PDG Delegate Card directly from the Certification Committee. Please note all delegates and alternates must be a member of Lions for one year and a day in order to quality.

<u>Example</u>: Your club has 20 members; you are entitled to two (2) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 44 members; you are entitled to four (4) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 37 members and a PDG; you are entitled to four (4) Club Delegates/Alternates and one (1) PDG Delegate.

The list of delegates and alternates along with their membership number needs to be emailed (or typed copy via USPS) no later than March 22, 2025, so the committee can process the credential in time for the convention. Credentials will be available for pick up the day of the convention at certification table. Thank you for your assistance and cooperation.









Dear Lion.






