IN LOVING MEMORY OF LION REVEREND DORIS HALEY

Reverend Doris Haley was a member and Past President of the West Chesier Daybreak Lions Club and joined the West Gosben Lions Club serving as Club Chaplain. She was also the PA Lions District 14 P Chaplain for 20 years and attended all District meetings. She served on the Lion James E Bing Miller Charitable Foundation for many years as a Board member and Chaplain. She was a Melvin Jones Fellow, a Bing Miller Fellow, and a Knights of Bing Miller Fellow. In 2009 she received the Lions International Presidents medal from PIP At Brandel. for her commitment to WE SERVE not only in Lions Club but in her community at large.

At the 40th Annual Dinner, held on January 26, 2007, the Southern Chester County Chamber of Commerce named Reverend Doris Haley as the 2006 "Outstanding Citizen". In 2010, Lion Doris was name Citizen of the year in the Avon Grove Lions Club. Lion Doris had dedicated her life to beloing those on the fringe of our society, those who are often shunned, neglected, impoverished. and forgonen. She had been the Chaplain at Pocopson Nursing Home for 44 years, the Chaplain for the Lions Clubs of Chester and Benks Counties for 20 years, and the Volunteer Chaplain at Chester County Prison for 51 years. As the Outreach Coordinator for families of prisoners for 49 years. Lion Doris helped to care for these families by obtaining, and providing them with vital necessities such as food, clothing, household items, furniture, heating, medicine, and much more Lion Dotis also encouraged these families with spiritual support through Bible Study and provided recruitional activities such as berbecues, hayrides, Mother's Day Lunch, and Easter Egg Hunts. She began the Christmas Angel Tree Program for the children of inmates at Chester County Prison a party and gifts for each child given in the name of the parent in prison. Support for this way held at an annual children's Christmas Soiree (pancake breakfast) with West Chester Lions Club and West Goshen Lions Club members. Many Lions Clubs supported Lion Doris with children's gifts and funding for her projects. Lion Doris established and was the Director of the School of Learning for the children of immates at Chester County Prison. The 2006 School of Learning served 125 children and ran a full-time summer program. Today the After School program for students serves 480, and classes are year around.

Her many efforts and achievements inspired others to share with the less fortunate. To help ensure the success of the School of Learning, local churches, groups, instructors, farmers, and individuals donate transportation, breakfast and lunch foods, instruction, supplies, fruit, and vegetables. She initiated the "Doris Haley Ministry for Children of Prisoners." Lion Doris did not take credit for her work, but believed it is an opportunity for God to work through others to provide for those in need. For all the lives she has touched and for her many acts of charity, Lion Doris Haley was truly an Outstanding Citizen, and a dedicated Lion in Service to all.

Rest in God's Peace, Lion Doris, you will be missed by those that knew and loved you.

LOPF GRANT CRITERIA

The mandate and challenge to Lions of Pennsylvania Foundation (LOPF) is to achieve significant humanitarian results, particularly those relating to sensory impairment programs within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, with the funds available. All grants authorized should meet the LOPF's major objectives — Humanitarian Services and Vocational Assistance.

Grant request cannot be for more than 50% of the District, Lions Club financial support. The applicant must have secured 50% of the needed income before applying for a grant from the LOPF. The club can raise funds as part of the 50%.

GRANTS

- <u>Humanitarian Service Grants</u>: These grants may be issued for permanent communal programs or institutes, which satisfy humanitarian needs in harmony with the objectives of Lionism.
- Vocational Assistance Grants: These grants may be issued for programs meeting a broad range of educational and training programs that provide a means for sensory impaired people to become self-supporting or to improve upon their economic and social well-being. Funds shall not be granted directly to individuals for such purposes.

LOPF sponsors activities that further reconstruction efforts, and that provide long-term benefits to as many sensory people as possible. Among proposed reconstruction projects, higher priority is given to those proposing the creation or reconstruction of new public facilities and services that benefit the sensory impaired.

CRITERIA FOR GRANTS

- Grants shall be authorized for projects meeting diverse human needs not adequately addressed by
 other programs, having a district Lions identification and character, and providing long-term
 benefits. Projects serving many people shall be preferred because of more favorable cost
 effectiveness, economics of scale, and lower costs per amount of service.
- LOPF does not provide assistance to offer services otherwise available through governmental, religious, charitable, social, welfare, or comparable service programs. Nor does it attempt to fund projects more appropriately the responsibility of Lions Clubs, Districts, or other Lions units.
- Grant Funds shall concern the financial burden of projects, which are beyond the scope of traditional Lions Club and/or District Fund-raising.
- 4. Projects shall be preferred that have high implicit promotional value.
- 5. Where grants are authorized for projects of a permanent nature, such projects shall carry a definite identification, as having been made possible through LOPF specifications, for such identification shall be provided by LOPF. Documentation of identification shall be included in the final report on the project to be submitted by the District.
- Where grants are approved for a single project, no further grants will be permitted to cover continuing operating expenses.
- 7. Because of limited resources, grants shall not be made on a continuing basis to any single project.
- 8. Grants may NOT be made to meet operating, maintenance, payroll, labor or in-kind labor expenses.
- 9. Grants may be authorized for non-Lious organizations or programs only when their services and facilities would significantly contribute to LOPF purposes, and when their specific capabilities, resources, economics, and efficiency euceed those of available Lious programs. The LOPF grant must represent a significant addition to such program's service capacity. These grant applications must go through and have the financial support of a District or Lious Club.
- 10. Applicant Lions Districts, and/or Chabs, upon the certification of the District Governor and sitting District Director, must not only indicate the nature and extent of their planned participation in the grant project, they must also make significant financial commitment on behalf of the project.
- Each grant application shall be judged solely on its own merit and the degree to which it meets these criteria and the operating policies of LOPF, as established by the Board of Directors.





REGULATIONS FOR LOPF GRANTS

The need for LOPF assistance must be documented by the submission, on a LOPF Grant Application form, of specific project plans and benefits, a project budget, and all other pertinent factors that may be requested by the Board of Directors. The project budget should clearly detail all project income and expenses, including allocations by item and detail. It should show all sources of income and expense, both received and projected. Project expense should equal project income.

- 2. Grant proposals may originate from any District or Lion organization. An application received must bear the District Governor's, and sitting board members of said District, signatures certifying the significance of the need addressed, the social value and operational feasibility of the proposed project, and the validity and reasonableness of the Grant Request. The certification of the Cabinet, or the Council of Governors in the case of a multiple district application, is also required. Cabinet or Council certification is to be evidenced by the submission of the minutes of the meeting at which the application was retrified.
- 3. Any club project must have the full support, including financial support, of the District or a Lions Club, before its application may be eligible for consideration by the Directors. The amount of District/Club financial support must be indicated in the sources of income of the itemized budget. The Lions organization must make a 50% financial commitment on behalf of the project consistent with their respective funding capacity. The financial support comes from the District, Lions Club and other outside sources of revenue.
- LOPF grant funds are intended for projects in the developmental stages, or for projects in progress. LOPF grant funds are not intended to repay loans or to establish reserve funds.
- 5. Grants issued to Lions Clubs or Districts will be made payable to the appropriate Lions Club or District (single, sub, or multiple). Such grants are to be approved by the District Governor or multiple district Council Chairperson who is in office at the time, the district board member and final approval is made by the Board of Directors. The grant sponsor is responsible to disburse and account for LOPF grant funds in his/her possession.
- Lions and/or their families should not receive direct or professional benefit or have proprietary interest in projects receiving LOPF assistance.






OWEN J ROBERTS MIDDLE SCHOOL LEOS






