District Governor Art would like all of you to examine the attached District Membership Register and see what you can do to improve your club's membership status in a positive way before the end of this Lion Year (30 June 2025 is the end date). District 14P has been experiencing a negative membership trend for the past five years, and we are on the verge of turning that into a positive direction! We are thankful to all of you that are working to improve membership as we are only down by 2 members at this time!! When you look at this table of membership for the District, consider the following: If you have less than 20 members in your club (the minimum needed to charter a club), you are considered a club at risk of losing your charter by the leadership. If you have negative membership growth, that is an indicator of growing concern for the leadership because you are not replacing your losses. Every club needs to always think about the future of their club by adding new members to replace those natural losses. If your losses are exceeding your gains, you may need to look at how you can reenergize your membership with new ways to serve. What we are asking is simple. Take care of your current members so they continue to be Lions, provide meaningful service which in turn will grow membership, and always embrace new ideas and members into our Pride. Appoint a Membership Chair in every club. Make growing membership a club priority. Our motto is: "We Can and Will Grow Membership!" We hope it is yours!

Dear Fellow Lions and Friends,

I have the pleasure, with my hair sticking out everywhere, to manage membership for Middle Atlantic Blind Golf Association, MABGA.

MABGA started in August 1948, a nonprofit, to give the blind and low vision a safe, full of smiles day out surrounded by friends while not having to worry about falling in a rabbit hole, tripping over a fallen branch or twisting an ankle on a vole tunnel. We have a junior program for ages 7 through 21 and an adult program for ages 21 through existence. One member is a 96 year old gentleman who still has fine mobility and golfing skills! I am sure his doctor thinks he is getting a little senile when he talks about golfing with fellow blind yesterday.

Each blind golfer has a "coach". The coach gives the blind golfer the lay of the land, distance for which club and lines the blind golfer up to swing. Of course the coach is the one driving the cart - the backseat driver is sitting right next to them. After a day of golf, however many holes are played, lunch is available. Some of our blind golfers and their coach play all 18 holes, others are a happy medium, while some swing sometimes and mingle more - each are muchly jolly to be out. There are moments of pretending it was a hole-in-one, not a lost ball in water or jungle brush just as in everyday golfing. The fish are curiously waiting for the big eggs to hatch as the squirrel still can not crack the white nut.

Signing up to be a coach, a blind or low vision golfer is easy and fast! We play an average of 29 outings a season - each outing is in a different course. The MABGA outings swing smoothly! Our web site lists them. We have 37 adult members and 13 perspective members. Perspective members are those coming out for the first time this year and will decide if they enjoy the heartfelt "crazy". Junior golf has a roster of 75, 37 are active - directed by Michael Molloy 215-400-0599 mgmolloy@aol.com

May the day be soon when all of these members are playing golf saying "Wow, I played better when I was blind" because new eyes became available. We have members that were born blind, lost their eyesight over time and those who lost it all in a car or other accident. Appreciate what you have today, be careful what you wish for - you may have more money tomorrow but not your eyesight.

We have a golf fundraising tournament each August to celebrate our anniversary while raising funds to keep MABGA swinging smiles strongly. A blind golfer created and runs our web site! As we continue to grow and serve our community, we ask for your ongoing support. The success of MABGA depends on the commitment of our members, coaches, friends and donors. Will you join us in helping MABGA continue to thrive and provide opportunities for blind and low vision golfers? Turning obstacles into opportunities!
