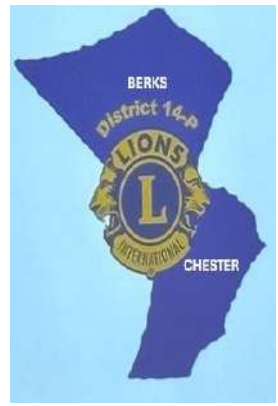

# DISTRICT LION CLUBS END OF YEAR REPORTS

Bally Lions Continue to SERVE After 54 Years

## BALLY LIONS

It's 1946. Thirty men from Bally, PA unite for the purpose of creating an ambulance corp., the Bally Ambulance Corp. Unfortunately due to lack of membership that club dissolved.

On May 1, 1971 the Bally Lions Club was re-chartered with 22 members. Over the years the club has continued to grow and currently has 39 members, last year volunteering a total of 1,514 hours. The club is proud to have one of the original charter members, Richard Quigley who is still an active member of the club.

One of the first big projects the Bally Lions undertook was the construction of two picnic pavilions in the community park. Some of the "giving back" projects the club has completed are: a scoreboard for the town's softball field, WELCOME signs at each end of town and park benches in the community park. In 2017, to celebrate Lions International's 100th Anniversary, the club devoted over 800 man-hours and \$35,000 to construct a one-mile walking trail in the community park. Lion Richard Quigley was recognized for his leadership and fundraising efforts toward the construction of the trail.

Since Lions International is known for its passion for eyesight and vision resources, the Bally Club sponsors eye and hearing check-ups (screenings) for several local church Pre-K and kindergarten classes. The club's 2024-2025 budget also includes donations to the PA Eye Research, Beacon Lodge Camp for Blind, Del Val Eye Bank, Leader Dog and Vision Resource Center (Berks County).

Some of the many projects the club performs include: a community Easter Egg Hunt, a Halloween Parade, Holiday lights, patriotic and individual Hometown Hero banners and the distribution of 140 Christmas Fruit Baskets to senior citizens. The club is also proud to provide several \$1000 scholarships to graduating high school students who are furthering their education. This scholarship program was established to honor the memory of Scott Moll who was a very active member and Treasurer of the club for many years. Since the scholarship program's inception several years ago, the club has given out \$22,000 to deserving high school seniors.

One of our most ambitious recent projects was the completion of a building, often referred to as our "clubhouse", to store our equipment and serve as a meeting place for some of our club events. The story behind this project started in 2019 when Billy Geiger, son of Lion Bill Geiger, Sr., began working toward his Eagle Scout Badge. He decided to help the club to build, what later became known as, our Medical Equipment Building. He applied for grants and requested donations from local businesses and with the assistance of Bally Lions members the building was completed.

The club's past secretary, Dennis Hafer played a major role in assisting with Billy's project. Dennis passed in 2020 and in honor of his dedication to the project it was named the Dennis Hafer Medical Building.

The Medical Equipment Building is home to one of the clubs biggest current projects, our medical equipment service. The club maintains an inventory of medical equipment including: hospital beds, wheelchairs, walkers, commodes, shower seats, etc. These items are cleaned and sanitized, tagged and logged before they are disbursed as needed to anyone in the area in need of medical equipment.

The medical equipment service is chaired by Donnie Conrad and he is assisted by Rick Ingram. Between the two of them they have logged many man-hours. Donnie and Rick's dedication to this project has made it a huge success! Recorded stats for the past three years and nine months are: 1,519 calls for equipment, 1,043 clients receiving equipment, 1,936 man-hours volunteered by club members and total value of in-coming and out-going equipment \$318,107. These are amazing numbers and the club is proud of this effort.

The International Lions motto "WE SERVE" is definitely evident through the dedication, time, values and camaraderie exhibited in the Bally Lions Club.

## BLANDON LIONS

The Blandon Lions Club started off the year with a Bingo Fundraiser, this was our third time hosting a Basket Bingo and the local residents had a great time with a wide variety of baskets of goods; they were also treated to hot dogs, hamburgers and homemade baked goods by our Lions club members. The evening was a success!

This was the first of various fundraisers and events we have throughout the year. Our Car Show in June was a success - the weather was overcast, but no rain and there were about 74 cars from 1930 through to 2019. Trophies were awarded and everyone had a great time.

Our Medical Equipment Service has been very busy over the last year. We gave out over 200 pieces of equipment to people in need.

Our Eye Glass Collection Bin at Maiden Creek Township Building and other locations around Blandon have collected over 1,000 eyeglasses that were given to the 14p District.

We also will be hosting our annual BBQ Chicken event on August 24th, where we normally sell about 1200 chicken dinners and again, patrons are treated to a huge variety of home-made goods by our Lions members.

We are not just fundraisers! Each year we host a Memorial Day Event, which is open to the community to come and pay tribute to all our veterans who gave the ultimate price.

We also participate in local parades with our 1947 Chevy Pick-up Truck, such as the Armed Forces day parade and local Halloween parades.

We Serve: We host a free Gathering at the Grove music event for the local community members in September with free food, desserts and entertainment.

We also host a Halloween Frolic, a free event for all the local children to come dressed up, have fun painting pumpkins, hunt for prizes and have a chance at winning a trophy.

Next year, May 9, 2026, will mark our Club's 70th Anniversary and will be hosting an event on Friday, May 8th in Blandon.

We increased our membership by 6 to 44. We are always looking for new members. We are very active on social media. The Club members have Lions Club lawn signs available for their homes.

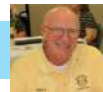
